

ILLINOIS CAN PREVENT ENVIRONMENTAL INJUSTICE

- 1. Creates the first definition of environmental justice in the Illinois Environmental Protection Act.
- 2. Requires translation services automatically be provided at public hearings in areas of linguistic isolation.
- 3. Requires that large air pollution facilities go through a local siting process that is similar to the process used for landfills and other large polluting waste facilities, increasing the ability for communities to weigh in on large air permitters.
- 4. Requires applicants for large air pollution facilities to hold public hearings in environmental justice communities and conduct a cumulative impact review of air pollution.
- 5. Gives community members standing to challenge more permitting decisions by the IEPA.
- 6. Creates a project bank in environmental justice communities for those that have violated pollution laws to ensure that projects are guided by the community.
- 7. Codifies a process for protected classes to file a grievance for civil rights violations regarding environmental pollution.
